

The New Brunswick Child Benefit Financial Pathway

To access the provincial New Brunswick Child Benefit, you must register your child for the federal Canada Child Benefit. Through this, as a resident of New Brunswick, you will automatically receive additional provincial payments to your monthly Canada Child Benefit.

The Canada Child Benefit (CCB) is a tax-free monthly payment to help eligible families with the cost of raising children under 18 years of age.

The Canada Child Benefit also includes more funding for children who live with a disability under the Child Disability Benefit)

The Child Disability Benefit is a financial support that is added into the Canada Child Benefit to support families with children living with disabilities. To get the Child Disability Benefit, your family must apply and be eligible for the Canada Child Benefit and your child must be eligible for the Disability Tax Credit.

The New Brunswick Child Benefit is funded by the province of New Brunswick and administered by the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA). This is a non-taxable amount paid to help low and modest-income families provide for their children. It is combined with the CCB to provide a single monthly payment, and does not require any further applications beyond that for the CCB.

The amount that you can receive is highly dependent on your annual net income, where in the province you live, and the number of children you have. To help calculate the possible Child and Family Federal and Provincial Benefits, please refer to the CRA website here.

The New Brunswick Working Income Supplement is an additional benefit paid to qualifying families with earned income who have children under 18 years of age. This additional amount is dependent on family income and is added to the Canada Child Benefit payments.

The New Brunswick School Supplement is a once a year payment to help low-income families (net income of \$20,000 or less) in New Brunswick with the cost of back-to-school supplies for their school aged children. Individuals who meet these conditions will receive \$100 for each eligible child who they have full custody of, and \$50 for each eligible child who they share custody of. It is added automatically to your CCB payment.

The New Brunswick Harmonized Sales Tax Credit is a tax-free quarterly payment that helps individuals and families with low or modest incomes with the increase in the harmonized sales tax.
